# STUDY 6

### **READ LUKE 6:27-49**

In this section Luke highlights that the life of God's 'new' people is characterised by 'obedience' ... obedience that will show itself in radical action!

### re-read Luke 6:35b-36

How does the passage seek to reveal what God is like? How should this motivate our actions in the present?

How do vv27-36 call on you to change the way you live?

re-read Luke 6:37-42
What specific commands and consequences are mentioned (vv37-38)?
What images are used (vv39-42)?
What kind of behaviour is discouraged? What response is called for?
How do vv37-42 call on you to change the way you live?
re-read Luke 6:43-45
What images are used?
What are you taught about being a follower of Christ Jesus?
What is one thing you've been challenged to do? Spend some time praying about it and start working on it this week!

# STUDY 7

In this section Luke reveals that God's 'new' people are 'faithful' followers of Christ Jesus ... that is, they are people who have recognised who Jesus is & who trust in him.

### To ponder ...

"The Bible uses the word 'faith' to mean simply 'trust' ... Now faith understood in this sense (as trust) lies at the heart of our response to God ... Here then is the New Testament way of responding to God - we are to repent and believe in the Lord Jesus"

What do you think of this statement: "It is not our faith that is important. It is the **object** of our faith that matters"?

STUDY 8

### **READ LUKE 7:36-50**

In this section Luke reveals that God's 'new' people ('sinners' who have repented) have been 'forgiven' much & so 'love' much in response.

### re-read Luke 7:36-39

Who are the main characters? What do you learn about them?

What surprises are there?

Who do you find yourself identifying with? Why?

### re-read Luke 7:40-43

Jesus tells this story to illustrate & explain something that's happening in real life. Match up the characters in the story with the real life people.

Moneylender Sinful woman

Person who owed 500 denarii (\$125,000) Simon the Pharisee

Person who owed 50 denarii (\$12.500) God/Jesus

Why do you think Jesus told this story?

### re-read Luke 7:44-50

How does the story Jesus told help you to understand the significance of the actions/attitudes of the Pharisee  $\mathcal{O}$  the sinful woman?

Re-read v47. How could you sum up the meaning of this verse?

Whose actions or attitudes are most like yours?

Is there an action or attitude that you need to change? How can you start working on that this week? Spend some time praying about it ...

# STUDY 9

### **READ LUKE 8:1-21**

In this section Luke highlights that God's 'new' people who have heeded his call to repent will continue to 'hear' his words & 'obey' them.

### re-read Luke 8:1-4

How does this passage pick up some of the major themes from earlier in Luke?

### re-read Luke 8:5-8

What or Who do you think each character represents?

### re-read Luke 8:19-21

Who does Jesus say are his mother & brothers ... his family? How does that make you feel?

Pick a question ...

- 1. What things stop you from hearing God's word? What could/should you change?
- 2. What things stop you from obeying God's word? What could/should you change?
- 3. Do you think you're in danger of 'life's worries, riches & pleasures' choking your growth? How would you tell?
- 4. What do you think it means to 'produce a crop'? Do you think you're doing that? Does it matter? How could you be doing it better?
- 5. What are some specific things you need to change after reading this passage? (Try & think of at least 3)
